
ECLIPSE OF THE SUNMONDAY, APRIL 8, 2024

Ask your librarian for a pair of eclipse glasses while supplies last. Fold them at the inner crease and wear normally. The eclipse begins at 2:10 PM and ends at 4:36 PM in New York City. The entire eclipse lasts 2 hours and 26 minutes with 90% of the sun covered at 3:25 PM. You will notice considerable darkening as the sky slowly turns deep blue. Daylight will take on an eerie quality because sunlight is dimmer and shadows become sharper. Look at shadows on the ground and you may see tiny crescents. Around 3:25 PM shimmering bands of light and dark may race across the ground at your feet. These are "Shadow Bands." One of you will first notice the "bite" into the sun and say, "I see it." Soon everyone else will see the same, too. Enjoy!
